Building and Construction Industry (Security of Payment) Act 2009 (ACT)	The earlier of:
	> 15 business days after a payment claim is given; or
	the date provided in the contract.

NSW	Section 11:
Building and Construction Industry Security of Payment Act 1999 (NSW)	> By the principal to a head contractor:
	❖ 15 business days after a payment claim is given; or
	an earlier date as provided in the contract.
	By the head contractor to a subcontractor:
	 20 business days after a payment claim is given; or
	❖ an earlier date as provided in the contract.
VIC	Section 12:
Building and Construction Industry Security of Payment Act 2002 (VIC)	> The date provided in the contract; or
	if the contract provides no express provision, 10 business days after a payment claim is made.

SA	Section 11:
Building and Construction Industry Security of Payment Act 2009 (SA)	> The date provided in the contract; or
	if the contract provides no express provision, 15 business days after a payment claim is made.
	No differentiation between head contracts and subcontracts.
QLD	Section 73:
Building Industry Fairness (Security of Payment) Act 2017 (QLD)	> In a commercial building contract, must not be more than 15 business days , otherwise the provision is void.
	> In a construction management trade contract or subcontract, must not be more than 25 business days, otherwise the provision is
	void.
	> If the contract provides no express provision, 10 business days after a payment claim is made.
WA	Section 20:
Building and Construction Industry (Security of Payment) Act 2021 (WA) (for contracts entered into on or after 1 Aug 2022)	By the principal to a head contractor:
	20 business days after a payment claim is given; or
	• an earlier date as provided in the contract. • Put the beauty and a substantial term
	By the head contractor to a subcontractor: The head contractor of a subcontractor: The head contractor of a subcontractor:
	25 business days after a payment claim is given; or an applier data as provided in the contrast.

Jurisdiction	Section
NT	Section 13 and 20:
Construction Contracts (Security Of Payments) Act 2004 (NT)	> Is the date provided in the contract, however, if that date is more than 30 working days after the payment claim, then it must be read as being amended to require payment within 30 working days .
	> If the contract provides no express provision, then:
	 within 20 working days after receiving the payment claim; or
	 (if an amount is in dispute) within 10 business days after a payment claim is made, the Respondent must give the Claimant a notice of dispute and pay the amount of the claim that is not in dispute (Schedule 1, Division 5).
	No differentiation between head contracts and subcontracts
TAS	Section 15 and 19(3):
Building and Construction Industry Security of Payment Act 2009 (TAS)	The earlier of:
	> the date provided in the contract; or
	if the contract does not expressly provide a date, before the expiry of the "applicable day", as determined under section 19(3):
	 20 business days after the payment claim is served on the respondent, if the claim relates to a residential structure to be built on land, the respondent is the owner of the land; and the respondent is not a building practitioner; or
	 10 business days after the payment claim is served on the respondent, in any other case.
